Summary and Additional Information
RROC Spring Tour 2007
Sunday April 15th through Saturday April 21st
Texas Wildflowers and Hill Country
College Station to Fredericksburg

The 2007 RROC National Spring Tour will begin in College Station, Texas. We will motor approximately 700 miles in six days traversing the back roads of scenic Texas en route to Fredericksburg, Texas. In addition to viewing indigenous wildflowers, we will visit numerous Texas landmarks and places of special interest such as the George Bush Presidential Library, Washington on the Brazos State Park, the birthplace of The Republic of Texas. We will visit some world famous Painted Churches of Texas. These were built over 100 years ago by early settlers from northern Europe who in turn commissioned artists from Europe to paint and decorate their churches. We will tour the antique Burton Cotton Gin Mill which was in full production when Cotton was King.

We will visit the waterfall at Pedernales State Park. While in Austin we will have the option to visit either the Texas Governor's Mansion or the LBJ Library on the campus of the University of Texas. We will take a break from the wildflowers and visit the Longhorn Cavern State Park. One evening's accommodation will be at a remote Texas Hill Country Lodge overlooking Lake Buchanan. We will tour the oldest winery in Texas and have lunch. Afterwards we will stop at Enchanted Rock State Park. The last two nights of the Tour will be in Fredericksburg where we will drive the renowned Willow City Loop Wildflower Trail and pass through legendary Luckenbach, Texas. There will be ample free time to visit the World War II Museum of the Pacific and the Admiral Nimitz exhibits as well as the nearby Wildflower Seed Farm.

We will dine one evening at an elegant old homestead B&B in Fredericksburg. You are invited to wear your best Texas attire. The End of Tour Dinner will take place at the Inn on Barons Creek Conference Center. You are invited to wear your best 1950s / 1960s attire.

TOUR HIGHLIGHTS

On Sunday April 15th tour check in and registration will be at the host hotel Holiday Inn Express in College Station, Texas, between Noon and 5:00 PM. There will be a welcome dinner at the Briarcrest Country Club three miles from the host hotel. Early arrivals in College Station will have the opportunity to tour the Bush Library and/or the Texas A&M Cadet Corps Center and Exhibit Hall.

Monday morning the Tour will begin with a short drive to The Bush Museum. If you have already visited the Bush Museum you can drive to the next stop and spend more time at Washington on the Brazos, the birth place of the Republic of Texas. Our lunch stop will be Lillian Farms. Lillian is a reproduction Victorian Mansion located in prime wildflower country. After lunch we will drive through the Texas back roads to view the wildflowers. We will overnight at the Holiday Inn Express in Columbus, Texas, and dinner will be on your own however Nancy's Steak House is recommended. It is one mile from the hotel.

Tuesday morning we drive West and visit two of the famous painted churches of Texas. These were built over 100 years ago by early settlers from northern Europe who in turn commissioned artists from Europe to paint and decorate their churches. We will lunch at a small gourmet French style restaurant in Burton, TX, after which we will visit the antique Burton Cotton Gin Mill which was in its heyday when cotton was king. We will visit another painted church en route to our overnight stop in Bastrop, TX. Dinner will be at the Bastrop ColoVista Country Club.

Wednesday we start with a drive through two state parks followed by a couple of hours of touring cross country through the Texas back country and lots of wildflowers. Lunch will be at an old time Texas BBQ joint in an off the beaten track place called Driftwood, TX. After lunch we will visit Pedernales Falls before retiring for the evening at the Holiday Inn Express South of Austin. We have not organized a formal dinner together as this location offers numerous dining choices. We will have off duty police officers as security at the Austin hotel. They will remain all night and until noon Thursday.

Thursday morning we will board a bus for a trip into downtown Austin. We will have a choice here to visit either the LBJ Library or the Texas Governor's Mansion. Upon returning from downtown Austin we will have a quick lunch at the place of your choice and get back to touring. We will turn West again and head into the Texas Hill Country. We will first encounter the environs of Lake LBJ and Kingsland, TX. The Longhorn Caverns State Park is the next to the last stop of the day. The overnight stay will be on the very North end of Lake Buchanan at the Canyon of the Eagles Lodge. This is a rustic and remote lodge on the edge of Lake Buchanan. The price at the lodge will be on a per person basis and will cover all accommodations and meals. Dinner will be at the lodge.

Friday morning we will have a leisurely breakfast and then tour southeast and over the Buchanan Dam and on toward the West side of the lake. There we will stop and visit Fall Creek Vineyards, the oldest winery in Texas. We will have lunch here before proceeding South to Enchanted Rock State Park. Friday late afternoon we will arrive in Fredericksburg, TX. We will stay at the unique Hangar Hotel for two nights. Dinner will be at an elegant antique B&B in Fredericksburg. Please wear your best Texas attire.

Saturday we will tour the famous Willow City Loop Wildflower Trail and pass through legendary Luckenbach, Texas. There will be ample free time Saturday afternoon to visit the World War II Museum of the Pacific and the Admiral Nimitz exhibits as well as the nearby Wildflower Seed Farm. The End of Tour Dinner will take place in Fredericksburg at the Inn on Barons Creek. Please wear your best 1950s / 1960s attire.

The Texas Region of the RROC will be holding its Concours Event on Sunday morning April 22nd. The National Spring Tour Members are welcome to participate.

To participate in the Tour of The Texas Governor's Mansion on April 18th, Wednesday in Austin you must clear security 24 hours in advance. To do this we will be required to submit copies of a driver's license or passport to the Texas State Police in advance for each person. Please allow us to scan your identification document at the hotel in College Station when you register.

The RROC Texas Region will be holding its annual Spring Meet and Concours in Fredericksburg, TX, on Friday, April 20 through Sunday, April 22. They will be joining us for Dinner on Friday and Saturday evening. They will also participate in the Wildflower Tour on Saturday. Likewise the RROC National Spring Tour Members are invited to participate in the Texas Region Concours Event Sunday morning April 22nd.

If you are planning to arrive in Texas a few days early, College Station is not the place to be on April 13th and 14th. The Texas A&M University in College Station has 25,000 plus undergrads. They are having Parents Weekend activities Friday April 13 & Saturday April 14. Most parents will be gone by noon on Sunday.

If you have the desire to come early, contact me and I will point you in the direction of a holding station hotel not too far away. Waco, Austin and Houston have nice places to await the passing of the college weekend events in College Station.

We have secured rental car and trailer storage in Austin, Texas, a convenient central location. We have also secured rental car and trailer parking at the Hangar Hotel in Fredericksburg, Texas. We continue to work on establishing trailer parking in College Station. We also will have rental car and trailer parking in Houston at the home of the Houston Bentley General Manager's mini "ranch" on the far West side of Houston. This location is convenient to I-10.

The shortest distance between these towns on good roads are as follows:

Fredericksburg to College Station – 190 miles
Fredericksburg to Houston (West side) – 215 miles
Fredericksburg to Austin – 85 miles
Houston (West side) to College Station – 85 miles
Waco to College Station – 93 miles
Austin to College Station – 110 miles
